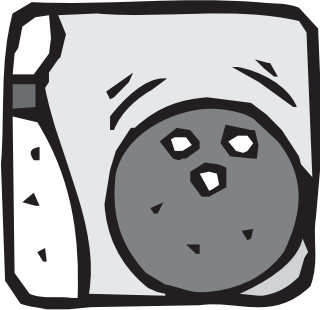

Matt Surina: A Life on the Lanes

When Matt Surina was 11, he saw a bowler roll a 300 on television. Right there, he told his father he wanted to bowl professionally.

Only one problem: Surina had never bowled before. "I'd never even been in a bowling center," recalls the Longview native. Fortunately, his school bus stopped within walking distance of Triangle Bowl. Surina took up the game and was soon practicing every day after school.

Progress was slow at first. "My first year of juniors I took four steps, had a big hop and threw a backup ball," Surina says. His father, meanwhile, thought bowling was just a phase and that his son would surely lose interest someday.

But Surina never stopped. Today the 58-year-old pro shop owner and former touring pro has a wall covered in trophies at his Lynnwood home, mementos of a career spent bowling with — and against — some of the world's best.

Nearby, a half-dozen scrapbooks overflow. Old recap sheets. Clippings. Firestone's invitation to the Tournament of Champions after his first PBA win in 1972. Photos showing Surina sporting an afro among other hairstyles and fashion statements "I was wearing [flashy] pants long before Guppy [Troup]," he notes.

In 1973, Surina won his second title at Bayside, New York, in memorable fashion: He averaged 250 for four games, and his victims that day included future hall-of-

famers Nelson Burton Jr., Barry Asher and Dick Ritger.

Surina toured for the next decade and made a handful of telecasts, but didn't win again until the 1981 Tucson Open. "I got to Tucson with just \$30 and my Visa card," he recalls. Qualifying second for the stepladder, Surina defeated George Pappas and Art Trask for his third title.

The win was worth \$12,000, but Surina had already toyed with the idea of leaving the Tour. "I didn't do well at the next stop, and I thought it was time to quit," he said. "I felt that I was good enough to make it out there. But it seemed like it wasn't meant to be any more. I felt the Tour favored a different kind of player than how I threw it. I was hitting the pocket with the best of them, but not striking with the best of them."

Surina quit the Tour later in 1981 and focused on getting into the pro shop business. "I didn't really have training in anything else," he says. "But I loved bowling." And he had picked up a fair amount of drilling knowledge during his Tour days.

His first pro shop opportunity came at Magic Lanes, thanks to then-proprietor and Surina's friend, Gary Mage. Ever since, Surina has operated shops around the state, drilling and instructing in places as varied as Tacoma, Bremerton, the Tri-Cities and Spokane. He and wife Joyce (who married at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno) were onetime proprietors of a center at Airway Heights, near Spokane.

Although his touring days are long over, Surina has continued to find success on the lanes over the years including a dozen NWBA titles, 10 PBA regional wins and an ABC eagle (the 1995 Singles title, won with an 824 series). In 2005, in the same Tucson house where he had won 24 years earlier, Surina beat Tom Baker for his first Senior title.

Surina continues to bowl regionally and in the occasional PBA senior event. A member of the Storm and Vise Grips staffs, Surina has operated the pro shop at Everett's Evergreen Lanes since 2000 and looks back on his long bowling career with fondness and few regrets.

"Even when I won, I knew I wasn't the best," he says humbly. "But when it happens, it's nice to be on top."

SOUTH SOUND USBC NEWS

Our Awards Banquet and Hall of Fame banquet was held at the Tacoma Elks on April 18th. The South Sound USBC tournament winners were recognized, the Men's Women's and Youth All Star Teams and Hall of Fame inductee. This year Tom Anderson was inducted into the South Sound Hall of Fame in the performance category. Tom is a 7 time All Star member, won the 2008 South Sound Masters and had the highest Sport league series for the 2007—2008 season with an 837. On two separate occasions he had the highest average for the State of Washington. He has had numerous 300 games, 800 series and a variety of tournament wins and he is the most tattooed member of the South Sound Hall of Fame. A most deserving inductee into our Hall of Fame.

Where Are The Young Bowlers?

In January of 1980, when I made my first televised finals on the PBA tour, the five bowlers on the show were Steve Cook, (age 23), Tom Baker (25) Jim Winklepleck (21), Tommy Kress (26), and myself (23). Last night, I watched a bowling doubleheader on ESPN the PBA "King of Bowling", Patrick Allen (38) defeated Mike Scroggins (45), then lost to "King" Wes Malott (32), in the next episode, Walter Ray Williams (age 49) defeated "young gun" Bill O'Neill (age 26), then lost to King Wes, who shot 300.

In last month's US Open finals, the last stop on the PBA tour, the four bowlers on the show were Amleto Monacelli (48), Richard Wolf (46), Chris Barnes (39), Mike Scroggins (45) and Norm Duke (45). Scroggins won the title, and received \$100,000 for his efforts.

In last's months Bowler's Journal, there was an article comparing the performance of the PBA "young guns" Sean Rash (25), Bill O'Neill (26), Rhino Page (26), and newly crowned player of the year and King of Bowling Wes Malott (although hardly a "young gun at age 32, I would call him a "grizzled veteran") to the performance of the "old guard" Mike Scroggins, Parker Bohn, Walter Ray Williams, and Norm Duke (Let's not forget Chris Barnes and Pete Weber). The comparison was by number of televised finals and titles the past two seasons, and the old guys were LIGHT YEARS ahead. The young guns are the future of the PBA, especially when it comes to marketing, and I certainly hope they can step up to the plate in a big way the next few years.

Now let's take a quick look at Bowling in the Seattle Association. The past four years in Seattle's premier bowling event, the Seattle Masters, the winners were 2006, Frank Deremer (age 51, defeated Hugh Miller, age 49), 2007 Bob Davidson, age 45, defeated Scott Halverson, age unknown), 2008 Hugh

Miller, (age over 50, defeated Bob Davidson, getting close to 50), and 2009, Hugh Miller defeated Curtis Messer, both over 50. Not one younger bowler (under 40?) in the mix. Where are the younger bowlers?

Let's again turn the clock back to 1980. That year, two bowlers from the Seattle Area, (Hugh Miller and Dave Beckmann) won titles on the PBA National Tour, when I won two (in Dallas and Amarillo) and Dave Beckmann won the Seattle Open. A few years earlier Dave and I bowled on the same team in Junior League at Belle Lanes, and the same Junior All Star team! When is the last time younger bowler from our area made a televised appearance in a bowling event, or for that matter, even won a PBA regional event! Where are the younger bowlers?

In my opinion, the best three bowlers in the Seattle area at this time are, not necessarily in this order, Bob Davidson, Hugh Miller, and Pat Johns, two over 50's and one who will be there soon. I am sure there are some out there who may not agree, but there really isn't much to argue when you look at the stats. Where are the younger bowlers?

This year I will bowl in the Seattle Tacoma All Star match on the under 50 side, probably for the last

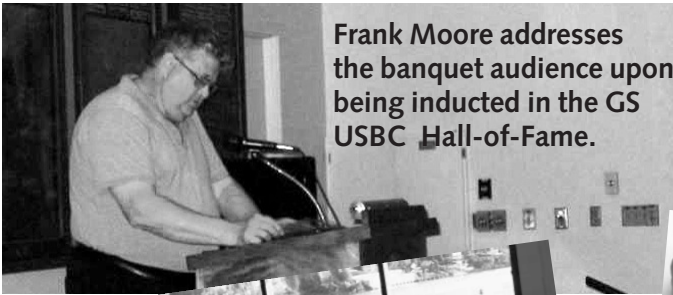

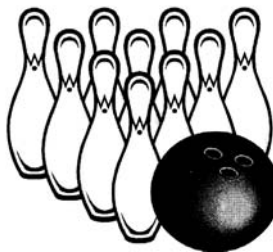
