March MADNESS a Win for Scott Holm at West Seattle Bowl

A full field of 64 bowlers turned out for the inaugural March Madness tournament at West Seattle Bowl Mar. 13. And when all of the eliminating got over, **Scott Holm** from Secoma Lanes emerged the victor, defeating **Robert Grieff** 258-251 to take home the \$2000 1st place prize.

The tournament resembled the college basketball tournament that is held every March to determine the NCAA national champion. A four game qualifying squad at the start resembled the regular season, then bowlers were seeded by how they did in qualifying. The only difference

was that a second chance bracket was awaiting the first round losers. Arkansas Pine-Bluff could look forward to at least two games.

Four games of cut throat elimination produced a Final Four of **Jeffrey Sumabat** going against **Robert Grieff** and **George Rushin** bowling **Scott Holm**. Grieff, who works at West Seattle Bowl, defeated Sumabat quite handily, 261-217. Holm narrowly defeated Rushin 281-276, sending the West Seattle bowler home with \$500.

Good news on the Kenmore Lanes front. Amidst rumors that the Bothell Way center was closing down after the league season this year, the owner has told all the leagues the center will be open at least one more year. An update of the center is proposed for the summer months.

When I first saw **John Hamilton** warming up in the Northend General League at Robin Hood Lanes last year, I thought that this guy was going to have a hard time making the league minimum 170 average. Not only was I way wrong, he made me realize that I might be bowling off the wrong foot. His right foot right hand delivery allows him a different ball projection than most right handers have, and that definitely is a good thing. Hamilton has made a big splash on the Northwest scratch bowling scene. I sat down and talked with John during a league session at Robin Hood.

STE: Where are you from?

JH: I grew up in Albuquerque, New Mexico, but I came here from Dallas, Texas about a year and a half ago.

STE: What made you come to Seattle?

JH: I was getting sick of Dallas and I am interested in going to the University of Washington. I would like to go into the Atmospheric Science program at the U-Dub.

STE: When did you start bowling and have you always bowled off the right foot?

JH: I started when I was five and I pretty much have bowled off my right foot from the start. They told me when I was ten years old that I probably should change, but I just kept getting better, so there was no reason to.

STE: I know you told me previously that you went to college at New Mexico University. Did you bowl there?

On January 28th, 2010, five bowlers comprising **Team Dick's Drive-In** walked into Secoma Lanes looking to bowl good as they hope every week and accomplish 3 goals they had set forth in the beginning of the year. To have a good time with their friends, beat their opposing team and pull closer to winning their league. Not knowing what was going to follow, they shoe'd up and started to practice. After practice – A couple of teammates mentioned to each other that they liked the reaction they were getting – they had no idea how right they were. The lights came on and the strikes ensued. Nobody could really miss, with three of the bowlers just falling short of throwing a 300.

The series that Dick's Drive-In shot was almost a state record as they missed by 7 pins. The combined score of 3726 scratch averaged out to 248.4 a bowler, which was said to be the highest in Secoma Lanes history!

It should be said that most of the bowlers get their equipment drilled by two pro shop operators, **Corey Gardner** who owns Bowldoc's Pro Shop inside Secoma Lanes, and **Pete Ekonomakis** who owns the pro shop inside West Seattle Bowl.

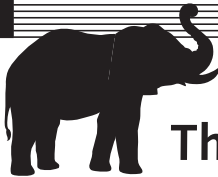

The "Right" vs. the "Left"

In the previous issue of the *Seattle/Tacoma/Everett Bowling News*, Seattle Bowling Association Vice President Marv Schmidt wrote in the "Pin Scatters" about how the "lefty-righty controversy" reared its ugly head again the past few weeks, when the top four finishers in the Seattle Masters were left handed, and again in the Edmonds Swiss, where left handers took home most of the money" Marv pointed out the less you have to change (left handers), the more success you will have, more bowlers on your side (right handers), more change. Marv is absolutely correct when it comes to bowling on a house shot (THS), but, there is a lot more to it, unless you only bowl on house shots (THS).....

Let's take a closer look at the situation. In most tournaments, 85% (sometimes more, sometimes less) of the bowlers are right handed, 15% left handed. In today's bowling environment, with high flare resin bowling balls, and high volumes of oil on the lanes, the lanes (if freshly oiled) begin to change almost immediately. The lanes will change dramatically on the right side after only a few games, changes occur at a much slower rate on the left side. On a typical house shot (THS), or a "modified house shot" (where there is high concentration of oil in the center of the lane, 4:1 ratio of higher) The scoring pace starts high on both sides, but drops quickly on the right side, giving the left side a HUGE ADVANTAGE, and left handers win, very simple.

On the other "hand", why don't left handed bowlers dominate the same way at the USBC Open, the US Open, or in the PBA? Let's take a closer look at that situation. The simple answer is more attention to lane maintenance, and tougher patterns (3:1, not 8:1!). When the oil pattern is flatter (sport shot, PBA condition), the lanes still change, often dramatically. However, when the scoring pace is low, often the shot will GET BETTER on the right side, and up go the scores! Not so on the left side, usually, when they are tough, they stay that way, and the lanes do not "open up" like

they do on the right side. Exactly the opposite situation from a house shot. There usually are not enough lefties to "open up" the shot. So there you have it, THS (typical house shot), right side breaks down, advantage left, longer flatter pattern, the more games bowled, the right side opens up, hard for the left side to keep up.

Sounds pretty simple, right? there is more to it than that, a lot more.....

So, how did lefties become the top 4 finishers in the Seattle Masters on a "tough" shot? The shot certainly was not "easy" on the left side (only one bowler in the tournament averaged 200)! Quite simple, the right handers moved in too fast and blew up the pattern, while the left handers (there were enough lefties bowling to create "change") all played the same part of the lane, and made the shot better! If the right handers

played further right early on, stayed together, and used less aggressive equipment, the shot most likely would have "opened up". Here is a link to Jeff Richgels blog about the 2010 USBA tournament and how to set up a lane condition:

It is my observation that most bowlers in this area DO NOT understand how to play tournament patterns, especially shorter patterns, where there is no "hold" in the middle, and the shot is close to the gutter, right and left handers alike. The majority of bowlers play too deep (to the left for right handers, to the right for left handers), and use equipment that is too aggressive, while trying to hook the ball too much. This results in the heads (front part of the lane) burn up (dry out) and the oil is carried to the outside of the break point, and a condition that is extremely difficult.

In conclusion, it is obvious the lefty's have an advantage on THS (typical house shot), and the playing field is much more level on tournament conditions. Unfortunately, most scratch tournaments in this area are still contested on house conditions. The main reason is the "politics of fear", if we don't make the lanes easy, nobody will bowl. Guess what, nobody is bowling now! So why not change? Easy house conditions are fine for recreational bowling and league play, beyond that level, it should be more challenging. That's the way it is in other sports.

If I was right handed, I would REFUSE to bowl scratch tournaments on THS, period. I would study

tournament patterns, learn how to manipulate the lanes from the first practice shot, and "have patience". If you want to wind it up and hook it, your time will come, but not until some games have been bowled. If I was a left handed "shark", I would bowl as many THS tournaments as I could find, load up in all the brackets, and laugh all the way to the bank. If I ran a bowling center, or a tournament organization, I would use Kegel tournament conditions.

(<http://www.kegel.net/patternlibrary/default.asp>), There are literally hundreds of lane patterns available that can be downloaded or programmed into a lane machine in a matter of minutes.

This past year, I have attended numerous junior tournaments. Most of the time they bowl on tournament patterns. This is great stuff, and the kids embrace it, so there is hope for the next generation of bowlers. It should be that way in all high level scratch bowling, whether it is the inner city all star match, a junior tournament, or a senior tournament. All it takes is just a little more time and effort.

JH: I actually went to New Mexico St University for two years and then transferred to New Mexico University in my junior year. I bowled both at New Mexico St and New Mexico University. At New Mexico, Gary Skidmore, the PBA pro was our coach. Our team wasn't very good and he basically didn't care. He would walk into the bowling center, look at our team and say "you guys are terrible" and then start watching all the other schools in the tournament. WE wanted to fire him.

STE: Were you on a Bowling scholarship?

JH: No, our program was a club sport. I could have gotten a scholarship from a smaller, less academically accredited school, but I didn't want that.

STE: Were you good in college?

JH: I averaged 215 and I was alright. I won the All American Collegiate Singles title one year, but I didn't really consider myself a good tournament bowler until I got to Dallas.

STE: What happened in Dallas?

JH: My breakout tournament was the Texas State tournament when I shot 812 in singles for second place and I came in second in the All-Events. There is probably 2,000 to 3,000 bowlers in this tournament and its probably the only time I'll ever see my name one slot ahead of Wes Malott. It was a huge deal to me.

STE: How would you compare the Dallas bowling scene with the Seattle Tacoma area.


JH: For scratch bowlers, its way better here. You would think, with the USBC moving to Texas and all that, that it would be great there, but its not. There's way more oppurtunity to bowl scratch tournaments here.

STE: Was it a hard transition to start bowling here?

JH: I didn't know any bowlers up here except I had heard of Bobby Davidson and I knew he was really good. In fact, I was kind of disappointed when I found out he was left-handed. But he has turned out to be my best bowling friend. He has helped me out a lot.

STE: What are your short term goals for bowling in the future?

JH: I'd like to bowl on a team with all wrong foot bowlers. We tried to get a trios team of Mike Kennedy, and Pat Johns who can throw off his right foot, and myself. But we would have to use Pat's regular average so we don't fit. A doubles team would be alright as well.

A byproduct of all of the Tour's growth is that often, the Tournament Winners are taking home \$2,000 or more. Local Tour Sponsors such as Emerald Queen Casinos, Miller-Lite beer, Hooters Restaurants and Precision Pro Shops have all played a large part in the Tour's meteoric rise and those nice payouts.
