Keeping Up With the Guys *By Kevin Hong*

Correen Lieber loves a good challenge.

Faced with a shortage of tournament opportunities for female youth bowlers, Lieber began bowling Junior Bowlers Tour events last season. She could have easily been a strong contender in JBT's handicap events, perhaps with multiple wins to her credit by now.

But instead, Lieber decided to step up her game from the very beginning by competing "against the guys" in the scratch division.

It's been a learning experience for Lieber, 17, who routinely bowls against the Northwest's top junior talent. She made the cut in just two JBTs last season (although a victory would be nice, she says her primary goal is to make the cut). She admits it's tough out there.

But the Issaquah resident believes that the only way to improve is to bowl against the best.

"I started (entering) scratch right away because I wanted the challenge," Lieber said. "It was a wake-up call. It taught me a lot of things. It taught me about making my makeable spares. There were no events for girls, so you just have to bowl against the guys. It's tough."

Lieber also recognized that bowling on less-forgiving lane conditions was a must, if she wanted to take her game to an elite level. These days she practices 50 games a week, and she's gone to a tournament most weekends.

Bowling has become her life ("I'm addicted to it," she admits).

Most of Lieber's tournaments take place on USBC Sport Bowling-compliant lane conditions, and she'll only bowl in Sport condition leagues.

Her dedication has paid off. Last summer, her

team won the limited division at the Junior World Team Challenge in Las Vegas. She then competed in the USBC Junior Gold Championships in Indianapolis, where she finished the first day of qualifying in 41st place but wound up short of the cut line on day two. Her summer ended in fine fashion with a 10th place finish in the Teen Masters in Reno.

Last month she placed seventh at the state Youth Masters, averaging 205 over 18 games on three different Sport patterns (and was the Open division's highest-finishing female by a large margin). A week later, she averaged

199 on two different Sport patterns at the South Sound Junior Swiss.

Lieber, who bowled her first 300 at age 15, is also a past winner of the state high school singles championship and the South Sound Elimination Tournament. She captained the **Greater Seattle girls' All-Star Team** last season, her *(Continued on Page 11)*

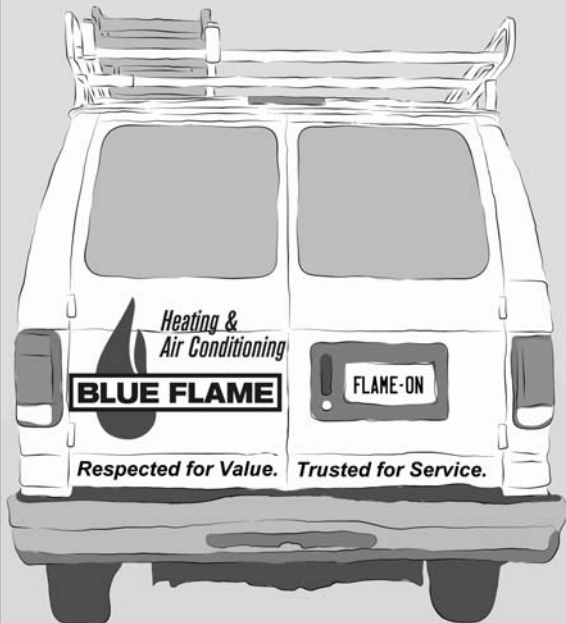

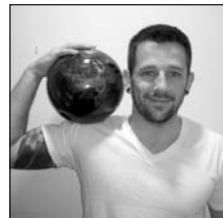
Unfazed, Coy rolls 300 in demanding GSC league *By Kevin Hong*

On the first night of bowling for Hiline Lanes' Wednesday scratch league September 8, one thing quickly became clear: Scores were going to be low.

The 900 Global Sport Classic League features many talented, experienced players, but only six of the 56 bowlers managed a 200-plus average on opening night.

Chad Coy, however, must have missed the memo. The righthander with the wide-sweeping hook rolled a perfect 300 that night, astonishing many of his fellow bowlers who were trying to figure out the demanding PBA Viper condition. Coy's 300 capped off a 916 four-game series (a 229 average, and still the season high series in that league as of press time). Even more amazing: Coy had taken the entire summer off from bowling following a cartilage and ligament tear in his knee.

"Last time I bowled was in June; (since then) I had only bowled one game of practice, one week before league started," said Coy, adding that he's scheduled for knee surgery in January. It was Coy's fourth 300 game and his first on a Sport Bowling-compliant condition.

Bowling and Baseball

Growing up my two favorite sports were bowling and baseball. If you grew up in Seattle, as a kid you played baseball in the late spring and early summer, and you bowled from September to April. My first bowling team was myself and a couple of kids from my little league baseball team. We decided to bowl together so we could keep a bit of team spirit going during the winter months.

In late October the World Series was upon us, but did you bowling fans also realize the World Series of Bowling (www.pba.com) was underway in Las Vegas, at the exact same time as Baseball's World Series between the Giants and the Rangers! Another interesting tidbit, the new headquarters of the USBC and the BPAA are located very close to the Rangers ballpark in Arlington, Texas.

I thought it would be interesting to compare and contrast the two sports. Both are "ball and stick" games. "Ball and Stick" games go back hundreds, if not thousands of years. A few other popular ball and stick games are of course golf, hockey, racquetball, tennis, cricket, and lacrosse.

So what do bowling and baseball have in common? Quite a bit, if you are (were) a pitcher, which I was before I became serious about bowling. A bowling lane is 60 feet long; the distance from the pitcher's mound to home plate is 60 feet 6 inches, almost identical. A bowler and a pitcher are both throwing a ball approximately the same distance, while using timing, strength, coordination, visualization, among other things, to impart energy on the ball (spin, rotation) and place it into a small window approximately 60 feet away. If you look at the shape of the triangle created by the 1-2-3 pins, and the shape of home plate, they are almost identical (although you must reverse home plate). The target you aim at (typically the "corner" of the plate for a pitcher, the 1-2 pocket for a left-handed bowler, or the 1-3 pocket for a right handed bowler) is about the same size, about an inch in diameter on either side, not a very big target considering the ball is

delivered from 60 feet away.

In both sports, there is a penalty if you miss in the center (nose hit in bowling, often resulting in a split), or a pitch down the middle of the plate (batter hits ball hard and far). Changing speeds, rotation, arm angles, and delivery speed are important in both sports, as is the ability to repeat shots and pitches.

I learned to pitch and throw a curveball before I learned the intricacies of how to make a bowling ball hook. It was my experience pitching that enabled me to visualize and learn how to make a bowling ball hook. The spin or rotation that makes a curveball "curve" is the result of the same "motion" and a similar release that makes a bowling ball hook. The thumb releases and the fingers and wrist impart the rotation or "spin", the more rotation, the more curve or hook. When I was 15

years old I spent hours experimenting with hand positions, different speeds, and combinations of the two that would make a bowling ball hook. Of course, today's bowling balls are completely different than the equipment I learned with in the early 1970's. Today's bowling balls almost do it all for you, they have many times the hook potential. On the other hand, the baseball is still 9 inches and 5 ounces; it acts about the same as it did many years ago.

Years ago I had several interesting conversations with several major league pitchers who also bowled about this subject (including John Burkett, who pitched for the Giants, Rangers, and Red Sox). Interestingly, Earl Anthony was a baseball pitcher before he was a successful bowler. Perhaps his experience as a pitcher helped his bowling career.

The World Series of Bowling concludes this week in Las Vegas. The first television date is Nov 28th on ESPN. You can check further air dates on the PBA website, www.pba.com

An interesting event occurred at Pacific Lanes in Tacoma on October 24th. The WCT (West Coast Tournaments) founded by Gary Klinich and passed on to Steve Skriniski with the help of his lovely wife Cindy, held a tournament with the theme being rollback the entry fees, this tournament which is open to any bowler was a huge success, they more then doubled their normal entry numbers. I know they had \$500 added but this is the entry fee of only 5 ½ bowlers, with the normal \$115 entry fee. I believe the lower entry fee was the mitigating reason for the large influx of bowlers. When the entry cost climbed to over \$100 for the WCT and the WWSSBA [a senior tournament organization which was also taken over by Steve Skriniski with Warren Severtsen] those who were marginal tournament participants and a lot of the regular bowlers dropped out stating that it just got too expensive. Bowling a one day tournament on a weekend, was a great diversion from sitting on the couch

watching football on television, most of the bowlers loved the competition and the camaraderie at the tournaments. The WWSSBA used to get from 60-70 bowlers on quite a few of their tournaments, now 30 would be a good number. I think a \$75 entry fee would be a manageable amount, after all there is only one first place, the majority of bowlers are happy to

just cash, maybe this would bring back some of the bowlers. I know that Steve and Warren are not making money off of these tournaments, so it has got to be a labor of love and I really respect them for that, winning a few bucks is nice but competing is the biggest thing.

I would like to see the Seattle Masters and the Seattle Senior Masters go to a reduced entry fee maybe their numbers would improve, the super senior masters, the really old guys has a \$50 entry fee and they draw as many bowlers as the younger seniors and not that many less than the regular masters.

I remember when pot bowling was really popular, it was a lot of fun and the competition was ferocious, each bowler put in a dollar and you drew a pill for partners, you could also get in a singles pot, your total outlay was two dollars plus lineage, the money was not much but you knew you were in a fight. Skyway Bowl still has pot bowling during the week at noon and it gets pretty dramatic at times.

So in conclusion if you want to bowl for the big bucks go to the High Roller in Las Vegas, locally, just make it affordable.

third consecutive year on the squad. And she was recently named one of the nation's top high school prospects by *Bowlers Journal International* magazine.

Lieber took up bowling after watching her father, **Randy**, bowl league at Sun Villa Lanes. She took to the sport quickly, bowling in Kenmore's junior program and winning the junior city all-events when she was about 10. She was also a successful gymnast at the time, and for a while she divided her time between the two sports. Bowling eventually won out.

"I quit gymnastics to bowl Saturday juniors," Lieber recalled. "I had some regrets (about quitting) at the time, but not so much anymore."

She credits her dad with helping her build the foundations of her game, and coaches **Ron Hoppe** and **Pat Johns** for refining it since then.

"My strengths right now are my rev rate and ball speed, which help to open up the lane, and the fact that I practice different lines," Lieber said.

As directors for the **Greater Seattle USBC Youth Association**, both Correen and her dad would like to see increased opportunities for local girls interested in bowling.

"Our biggest issue is not having enough competition for the girls," Randy Lieber said. "We need to try and get more girls excited about bowling." The Liebers jointly manage the youth association's website (www.youthbowling.org), which promotes local youth leagues and tournaments.

Meanwhile, as a high school senior with her sights set on bowling for a varsity college program someday, Correen has simple advice for kids wanting to get more serious about bowling.

"Bowling with the guys makes me push myself, because I always want to keep up," she said. "So push yourself harder. And always keep practicing."

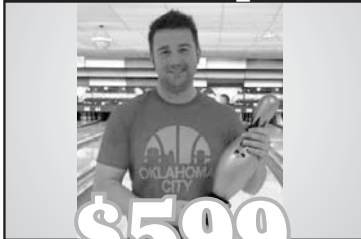

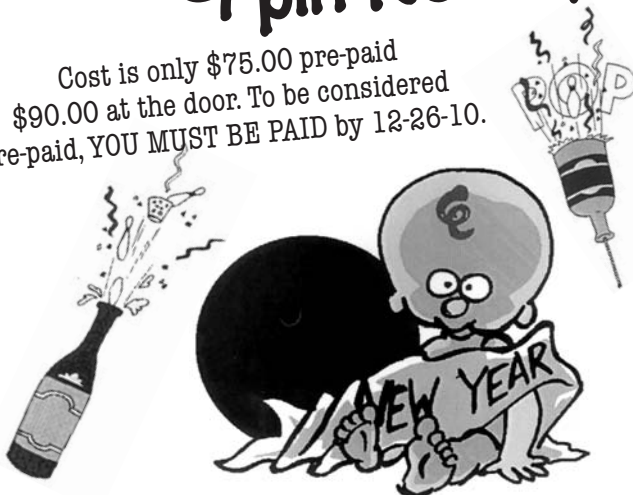
