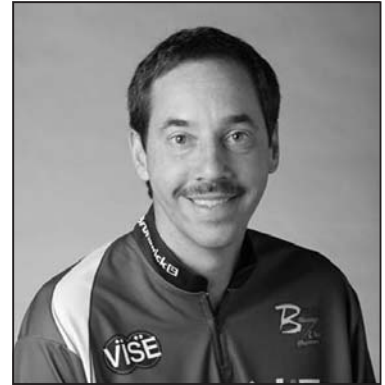

Last year **Walter Ray Williams Jr.** was the big draw and this year it was **Parker Bohn III**. Nice guy Parker and his 32 National titles. A pretty good crowd showed up both days and Parker did not let the faithful down as he won the **2010 Secoma Lanes Open** July 17-19. One Handed-Two Handed bowler **JT Action Jackson** of Valley Village, California, the point leader in the west, took second. Warren Severtsen Takes Inaugural Puget Sound All Star Senior Tournament

Never throwing a game under 238 in the finals, **Warren Severtsen** won the very first Puget Sound All-Star Senior Tournament held at Evergreen Lanes Sunday Aug. 22nd. **Steve Skrinski** of Kirkland finished second in the field of 26 bowlers.

Actually, the **Puget Sound All Star Senior Tournament** is the renamed **Western Washington Bowlers Association** that has been around since the 1990s. The great promoter of that association, **Rex Miller** passed away last year and this year the tournaments will be run by Severtsen and his wife Monica, and Cindy and Steve Skrinski.

The turnout at Evergreen was rather smallish, but from what I've heard everybody that bowled had a good time. There also was a golf tournament at Everett Legion Golf Course that preceded the bowling tournament.

Two tournaments in the Seattle Tacoma area this summer really summed up the state of flux that bowling currently is in. The PBA Regional at Secoma Lanes drew over 100 bowlers for the pro portion of the event. The Pro Am also pulled in over 500 bowlers. Now, I'm sure this had a lot to do with Parker Bohn bowling and another great job by Mike Martin and the staff at Secoma Lanes. This has turned into one of the premier events in bowling in the northwest region. It does have a little bit of the feel of the old national tour stops held at Leilani in the 70's and 80's. Almost, but not quite.

On the other hand, one of the tournaments that was tremendous fun for both men and women was the Pyramid tournament held in August every year at Sunset Bowl, Robin Hood Lanes and West Seattle Bowl collectively. The tournament was started by Gerry Klinich back in the 90s at Sunset Bowl and was one of the best tests of bowling skills for mid level scratch bowlers. This years tournament had 6 teams signed up at Robin Hood Lanes and they needed twelve to run the tournament. Maybe next year.

I hate to be on the whining bandwagon again, but the price to bowl a PBA regional as a guest is terribly insane to me. Two Hundred and eighty dollars is way out of what most good bowlers can afford and I think they dilute the field by catering to the people who can afford it as opposed to making it affordable to all top level bowlers. Kudos to both Bowlero and Secoma Lanes for running multiple qualifying squads into the tournament. Sixty five bucks as opposed to \$280 is way more palatable.

It Happened Sep Oct 2001

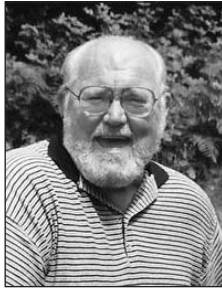

Don Norrell Remembered

On July 23 the South Sound USBC lost its long time association secretary with the passing of **Don Norrell**. He had been battling cancer for some time and finally succumbed to the disease. Don's first year as secretary for the GTBA was the 1986-87 bowling season. He retired at the conclusion of the 2004-2005 season. Prior to his hiring as the association secretary he had been a member of the board of directors. He was also secretary of the NIBC tournament.

Don led a long and varied life. He had numerous civilian jobs before joining the Navy in 1943. He was discharged in 1949. He later joined the Air Force Reserve and he was called up in 1950 and retired from the Air Force in 1966. He worked at McChord until 1986. In his spare time he was involved as a participant, coach and umpire/referee for baseball, softball, basketball, volleyball and soccer for over 30 years. He is member of the South Sound and NIBC Hall of Fame. He will be missed by his family and friends.

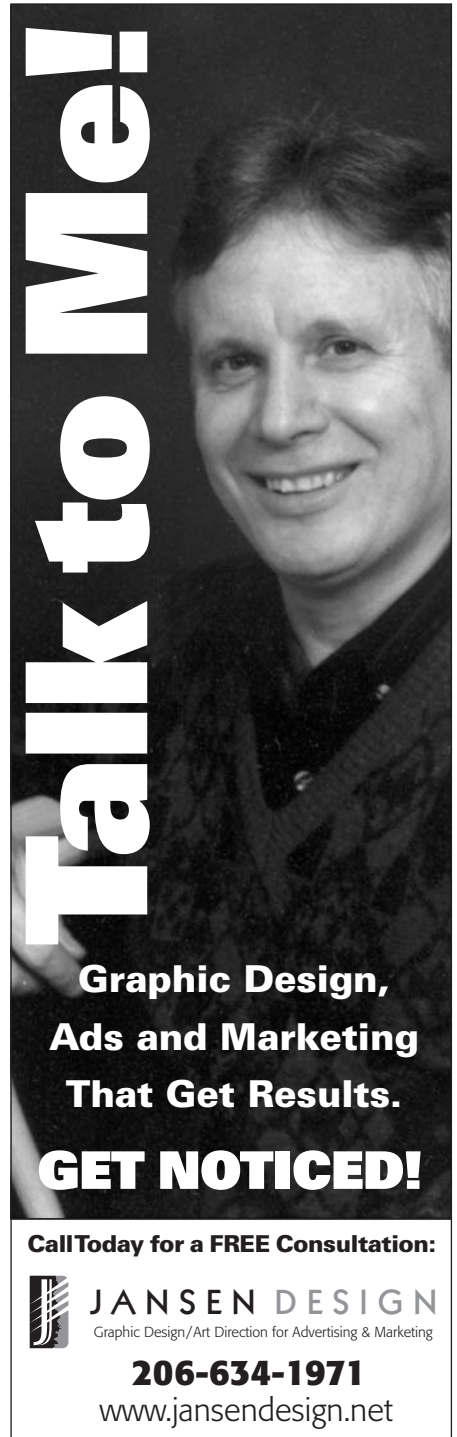

The Typical House Shot

Hugh Miller refers to this as the typical house shot, I would rather call it "The Happy Shot". Something the average recreational bowler can score on. That is about 99% of the people who bowl. I do not advocate a 'wall' or 'blocked shot'; just a modified house shot that is score-able. I think the vast majority of bowlers would enjoy this type of shot more than getting their brains beat out by a grueling sports condition. The elite bowlers are still going to win their share of tournaments, but it will make it more fun for the rest of us.

I believe that the ball manufacturers, along with the PBA, created all the different patterns simply to sell balls. It is a lot different from the old days when bowling was really popular. With just a rubber and a plastic ball you were good to go.

Mr. Miller, in a recent article, wrote that you have to bowl on tough conditions to aspire to bowl at the national level. I guess this is true in the PBA. In our corner of the country, from Alaska, Idaho, Montana, Oregon or Washington, there is only one exempt tour player. I don't believe it is because our conditions are easier, we have had the PBA experience leagues around for a few years.

I think it is simple economics; it is next to impossible to make a living as a touring pro. If you take the number of bowlers who bowl tournaments and the number who make a living at it, it is very miniscule. I have read where the decline of bowling has been attributed to easy scoring conditions. It is much more complicated than that, it may play a part, but it is a very, very small part. I believe that the majority of kids who are athletically inclined tend to go into baseball, basketball, football etc. With the advent of video games those who might take up bowling use their spare time playing video games.

Mr. Miller's recent challenge to a few sports writers as to how hard it is to bowl 30-40 or more games in a tournament only applies to the PBA. All the other venues require half as many games as that or less, so being in shape to bowl that many games is not a factor.

I respect what Hugh has accomplished in bowling, he is the premier kegger in our area and has been for many years. He is the one to beat in any tournament. So please lighten up on this hard-tough shot stuff.

So in conclusion, it is much more fun to average 200 and not make the cut then it is to average 160-170 and be miserable.

THE "BIG THREE"

Last year, I wrote an article titled "where are all the young bowlers", the subject dealt with the "graying" of the bowling scene, both locally and nationally. I only discussed the PBA Tour and the Seattle Everett/Tacoma scratch bowling scene, not the youth bowling scene. The youth bowling scene is alive and well both in the northwest and nationally, the northwest has produced some very talented bowlers the past few years, the likes of **Tyler Cruz** from Tacoma, **Cameron Weier**, Federal Way and **Marshall Kent** from Yakima.

While all three of these talented young bowlers have been tearing up the lanes the past couple of years, this summer, it was Marshall Kent who took the youth bowling scene by storm at the national level. Marshall, already the owner of 8 JBT (Junior Bowlers Tour) titles, the 2008 and 2009 Washington State youth masters champion and 2010 State Pepsi Champion began his summer by winning the Junior Team Challenge in Las Vegas in June. Next it was on to Indianapolis for the Junior Gold event in July, where Marshall took on over 1,000 of the best junior bowlers in the country, winning the event with a thrilling come from behind 269-265 victory over Mathew Gasn, taking home the hardware and a \$ 10,000 scholarship. Marshall followed the Junior Gold victory by winning the 2010 North Pointe High School Championship and a \$ 15,000 scholarship. Not

finished yet, he traveled to Arizona and won the JBT Desert Open. He was named the Bowling Writers Association of America "Bowler of the Month" for July 2010. Marshall's scholarship earnings for the summer of 2010 add up to nearly \$30,000.

Marshall attends West Valley High School in Yakima, where his parents Jim and Susan, along with partner Harry Mickelson own and operate Nob Hill Lanes. His future plans are to attend Robert Morris University, with a major in business management and accounting. A collegiate bowling career is on his radar screen, and then possibly the pro tour. Marshall's favorite ball is the Hammer Midnight Vibe, and his favorite musician is Jimi Hendrix. He has some good advice for younger bowlers, "take more time on your spare shots

than you do on your strike shots. They end up making a much bigger impact on your scores than strikes do".

Tyler Cruz from Tacoma was red hot the weekend of August 28-29 when he captured two JBT titles on consecutive days, first at Imperial Lanes in Seattle, then again the next day at Acme bowl, where he defeated red hot Marshall Kent 213-201 in the title match. Tyler also plans to bowl in college, likes Columbia

bowling balls, and advises younger bowlers to "practice, practice, practice one thing at a time, and practice your spares!"

Cameron Weier of Federal Way finished 11th in the Junior Gold last July (the same event won by Marshall Kent). He is a regular top finisher in the junior events around the northwest. Cameron also had a productive weekend August 28-29 in the JBT, finishing 5th at Imperial Lanes and 3rd at Acme Bowl, losing to his friend Tyler Cruz in the step-ladder finals on both occasions.

These three young men represent an unbelievable amount of bowling talent, and have already collected a ton of hardware and scholarship money. They are serious competitors and also good friends off the lanes; they seem to push each other to higher levels. Years ago, when I was a young bowler, I looked up to the "big three", Marshall, Mark, and Earl. Young bowlers in the northwest have their own "big three" to idolize, Marshall, Cameron, and Tyler. I doubt these three will be teaming up in the 616 Swiss anytime soon!

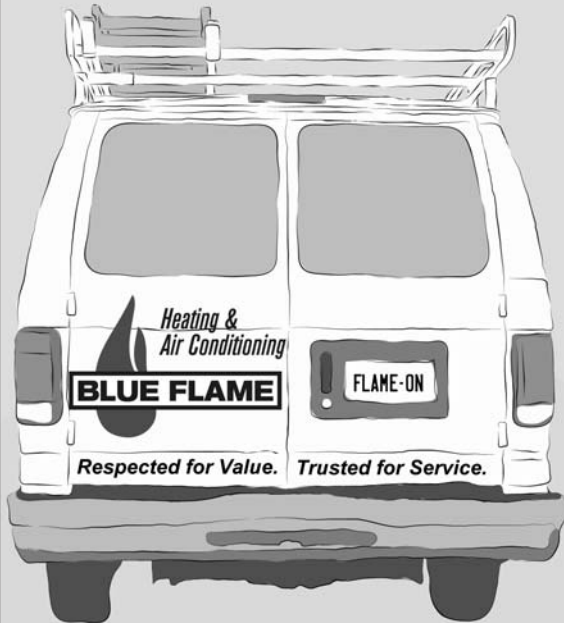

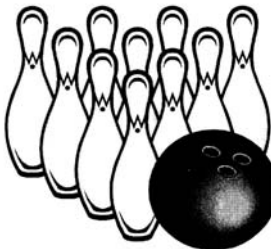
