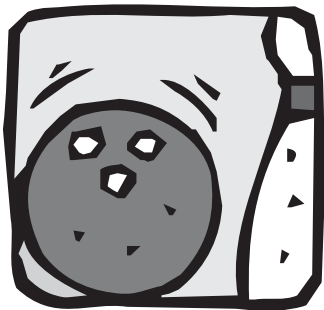

Tuholski Takes the Redhook Open

After a long drought of not winning on the PBA Regional circuit 32 year old **Craig Tuholski** of Washougal, WA won the 2007 Red Hook PBA Regional at Sunset Bowl on May 20. Tuholski downed Dave Wodka of Las Vegas, NEV 198-178 in the championship match.

Fifty five bowlers started the day on

Saturday bowling an eight game block. The field was then wittled down to 18, with a cut score of -9 making the semi-finals. Two non-members, Gary Tameno of Seattle and Todd Brown of Tumwater made the top 18.

Five more games were bowled after an hour break and after the dust had cleared it was looking like the W show was going to dominate the tournament. Chris Warren of Grants Pass, OR was first, Dave Wodka second, and Jason Williams of Vashon Island was third. Tuholski just barely made it into Sunday's Bracket Round finishing the semis in 8th place.

So Craig had to face the hot Chris Warren in the best of five match and Warren could not keep up the pace he set on Saturday, losing to Tuholski in 3 straight games. Wodka disposed of Kevin Croucher also of Grants Pass in 3 straight games and Jason Williams also dispensed of Cory Husted in 3 straight. In the most exciting bracket match, Mike Bronsart of Phoenix, AR had to punch out to defeat Mitch Beasley of Franklin Texas in the 5th and final game of their match 214-204.

That set up the Round of four with Tuholski defeating Bronsart 211-201 and Dave Wodka walking all over Jason Williams 248-156.

Going into the championship match, Wodka was averaging 221 to Tuholski's 206. It looked like it was Wodka's tournament to win.

But Tuholski had other ideas as Wodka definitely struggled in the final match and Tuholski claimed the \$2000 first place prize.

For Lefthanders Only

In the sport of competitive bowling, the left handed player faces some unique challenges. One of my biggest challenges, as a left handed competitor, is finding other bowlers who understand the game on the left side. Often, much of what is said about the left handed player is folklore.

Here are my top ten lefty myths, and some anecdotes:

- 1) It's a lefty house.....I have heard this one virtually every time I walk in the front door. I wonder if the people who built the place in 1958 had that in mind. If the owner is a lefty, then I guess you could call it a lefty house.
- 2) Lefthanders can't play inside.....Tell that to Jason Couch or Patrick Allen. I love to play inside, wish it happened more often. In order for this to happen, you need a lane man who knows what they are doing.
- 3) They are walled on the left.....Generally, if the left is walled, so is the right.
- 4) Two lefthanders are not allowed to bowl together in a doubles event together.....This was actually "unwritten" policy at one time in the PBA NW Region. This was not the case on the National Tour. I won the last PBA Doubles held in 1992, had a pretty good partner, Parker Bohn III.
- 5) Lefties can't move their feet.....before the new lane machines and heavier oil, lefties did move

their feet more. These days, all too often the oil just goes to the backend and it is hard to get any reaction. I would love to move in and have some friction to open up the lane.

- 6) If a lefty bowls well, it's because the lanes are easy on the left, if they bowl bad, they can't adjust..... See number five.
- 7) If lefties do well in a particular event, next time the event is held, no way will there be a similar shot.....very true.....See number six.
- 8) Recently, one of my friends told me the guy in the pro shop tried to sell him a ball that was "made for the left-handed bowler"the only ball that I remember marketed specifically for a left or right handed player were the Roto Star and Roto Grip from the mid seventies. They were pre balanced with finger and side weight marked on the box. Great marketing idea, great ball. I do think solid reactives work best on the left, whereas right hander's tend to use more pearlized equipment. The pearlized equipment clears the front of the lane easier.
- 9) Left handers are not as smart as right handers.....yes, I have heard that one many times... ..scientific research suggest the left and right side of the brain work differently. I wonder how many left handed presidents there have been. Isn't former President Clinton left-handed and the current President right handed?

10) My all time favorite. If 10% of the bowlers are left-handed, they should only win 10% of the money. That's like "grading on the curve"..... An athlete should be scored by his or her performance, not which hand they use.

In one of his final interviews as a competitive bowler, the late great Earl Anthony told ESPN commentator Denny Schriener, " I would like to be remembered as a great bowler, not just a great left handed bowler."

Kenmore Junior Bowlers Win Pepsi State Title

After nearly six months of bowling competition, two girls from Kenmore Lanes Jr. Bowling League will move on to represent the State of Washington at the national level in Buffalo, New York this summer. The Pepsi Championship Tournament begins in October in all fifty states. The bowlers advance through league, local, regional and state competition. At each level, 50 to 75% of the fields are eliminated, leaving only the top bowlers competing at the state tournament that was held this past weekend at Zeppoz Lanes in Pullman. On Saturday, May 19th, the bowlers in each of the four divisions bowled six games on a difficult sport condition to cut the

field to eight in each division. On Sunday, May 20th, the eight finalists bowled head to head and finished with a position round determining the winners. Katrina Everett from Kenmore Lanes won the girls scratch division and will compete in the Jr. Gold Tournament in Buffalo in July. Nicki Bradshaw, also from Kenmore, won the girls handicap division and will compete in the Pepsi Nationals the following week in Buffalo. 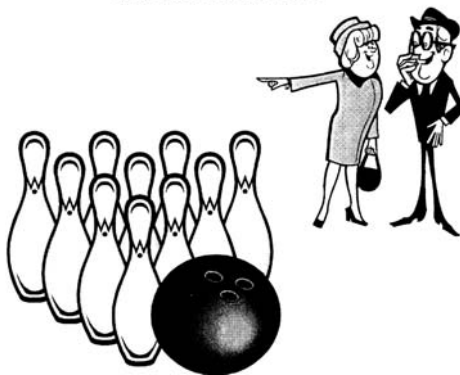
