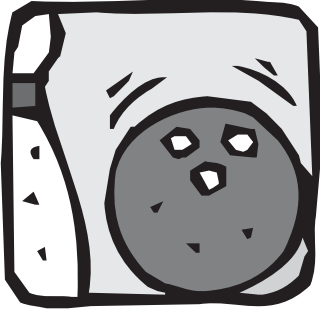

An Interview With Roy Lynch

When the dailies and the local newspapers went looking for an interview with someone who works at Sunset about the bowl closing, they interviewed the people who worked the day shift. Roy worked graveyard at Sunset and was instrumental in the success of the 26 lane house in Ballard.

STE: How long did you work at Sunset?

ROY: Let's see; I started there when I was 19 and I'm 44 now. I think its about 25 years.

STE: How do you feel about losing your job?

ROY: What a lot of people don't understand is this was a big part of my life. I'm not just losing a job, I'm losing a big part of my life!

STE: Ten years ago, could you foresee Sunset closing?

ROY: This place makes so much money! Its not closed because it wasn't making it. The land is too valuable for it to remain a bowling center. When Leilani closed down two years ago, I could see that Sunset was vulnerable too. The difference between Leilani and us was that we made a lot of money and Leilani was just barely scraping by.

STE: I noticed over the years there seemed to be this rivalry between the two centers. Why was this?

ROY: It seemed to us that Sunset would do better than Leilani and the improvements always seemed

to go to Leilani. Maybe for a longtime Leilani was considered the house for the PBA tour.

STE: One big difference between Sunset and Leilani was that Sunset stayed open 24 hours and Leilani basically closed at midnight.

ROY: I was working the graveyard and we were staying open 24 hours on the weekend, and I suggested to Jack Leary (GM at Sunset), that I'm here all night we might as well open the lanes up 24 hours all the time. Sometimes there was a waiting line for lanes at 2:30 AM in the morning on a weeknight.

STE: How was the rest of the staff to work with at Sunset?

ROY: We had great personnel and it was why we were successful. Verl Lowry and Jack Leary were easy to work with, you knew where you stood with them and that's all you could ask. And while I'm at it, I think Verl should get some recognition from the city association for all he has done for bowling. The guy has averaged 200 for 40 straight years, worked as a pro-shop operator, manager of the bowl, and was a big supporter of tournaments around the Seattle area.

STE: So what are you going to do?

ROY: I would like to catch on at another bowling center somewhere working the graveyard shift. Maybe I can keep another center open for 24 hours a day.

South Sound Bowlers Near Top at Nationals...

The annual trip to USBC Nationals always includes the big three; team event, doubles and singles. Bowlers from the South Sound will continue their trips to the tournament through the month of June; however, there are some that have already made an impact on the scoreboard.

On April 9th, **Clark Brothers Landscaping** consisting of team members **Mike Anthony, Larry Fulton, Layton Shirley, Mike Clark, and Erik Mattingly** rolled a nice 3073 to secure 53rd place on the leader board. Their efforts were underscored by Larry Fulton's 636, Erik Mattingly's 637, and a 678 rolled by Mike Clark. With doubles and singles coming up the following morning, the team knew they each needed to keep their roll going. Fortunately for one team member, the roll never stopped.

Mattingly followed the team event with a 727 series in doubles. While he dialed into his best set of the trip, his partner, **Bob Hanson, Jr.** busted out with a 279, and finished with a 714 series. Their 1441 doubles score earned Mattingly and Hanson a 3rd place finish, which they hope will hold up through the remaining two months of competition.

On a separate trip to nationals, **Danny Combs** made a splash in singles after a slow start in his team event. Commenting in a bowl.com interview, Combs explained that this trip to Nationals was both the worst he's ever bowled (in team event)... and the best he's ever bowled (singles). Why was he interviewed? He shot only the seventh **300 game** of the USBC Tournament in his 747 singles effort giving him a very nice tie for 26th place on the singles leader board.

So you never know when it's going to click for you team, doubles or singles. But these bowlers prove that the nine games at Nationals give ample opportunity to shine - in any event.

Brackets: Skill, Luck, or Gambling (revisited).

Just a little over ten years ago, I wrote an article about brackets (published in the Van-Port bowling news), voicing my opinion brackets were closely tied with illegal gambling, and did not belong in scratch bowling tournaments. Today, brackets are still going strong, although scratch tournament participation has diminished by leaps and bounds in most organizations.

Let's take another look at the mechanics of "bracket bowling". In most cases, a bracket consists of a three game set where bowlers are divided into groups of eight. Each of the eight players is matched against the score of another in the group the first game (in most cases by a computer generated program), with four winners. The four winners compete head to head with an opponent in the same group in game two, then the two remaining winners go head to head in game three to determine the winner of the bracket, much like a mini NCAA tournament format.

In most leagues and tournaments, a bracket entry is either \$5 or \$10, so the typical bracket handle is either \$40 or \$80 (I have also seen \$15 brackets with a handle of \$120). The typical payout is \$25 to the winner and \$10 to the runner-up in a \$5 bracket, \$50 to the winner and \$20 to the runner-up in a \$10 bracket, and \$75 to the winner and \$30 to the runner-up in a \$15 bracket.

The real financial mechanics of brackets consider the "house" ("bracket man", or "bracket woman") keeps one of the eight entrees, \$5, \$10, or \$15 depending on the entry fee. The amount to the "house" represents a cool 12 ½ % of the action. If a league or tournament does \$1,000 in brackets, that's \$125 for the house, do \$5,000 in brackets and you

make \$625, do \$10,000 and you make \$1,300. If a tournament has 100 bowlers play an average of \$100 each in brackets, the bracket man makes a guaranteed \$1,300.

If you ran a 20 tournament tour and did an average handle of \$75,000 per event, that's a handle of \$1,500,000. The house profits \$187,500. That's a nice chunk of change for handling other people's money, with no risk.

I first encountered brackets at a scratch event in San Antonio, Texas in the mid 1980's. As the interest rates declined in the mid to late 1980's, brackets became big money in mega bucks tournaments, and were a big draw in the team challenge events in the 1990's. As far as I know, brackets have never been offered in PBA events.

Whereas bowling is absolutely a game of skill, the random draw of brackets brings the element of luck to the forefront. For example, bowler "A" can shoot 245-248-256, and lose out, while bowler "B" could win the same bracket with 246-185-195. It depends on who you draw, especially in the first and second game. It seems many bowlers like bracket action; it is possible to defeat a more skilled player with a lucky draw. Most highly skilled players bet every bracket available in order to maximize their odds of success.

I feel there is a fine line concerning the definition of gambling where brackets are concerned. If the 12 ½ percent take all went to a specified charity, maybe it would be good for the image of bowling? One thing for sure, brackets are a racket, and it looks like they are here to stay.

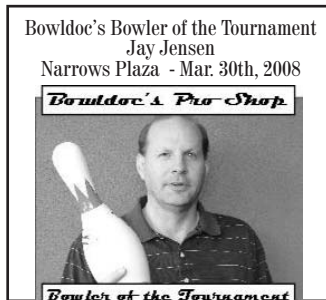

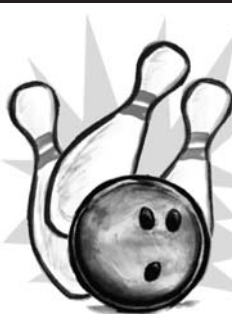
